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We All Need Exercise

- [1] The body eventually needs exercise. Exercise burns calories and keeps the body strong. It works your muscles and increases the activity of your heart. The heart works hard in order to send blood to your muscles. So, exercise makes your heart and muscles stronger to cope with daily movement, growth and to fight against illness.
- [2] Food is a source of fuel we insert into our bodies to be burnt as we walk, talk, take part in sports and even breathe. Sometimes we eat far more than we can burn off, which causes problems with the body storing too many of these fuels, that is fats, causing obesity.
 - [3] Exercise should be done to make you feel happier. During exercise, the body feels some stress and pain. Then, it releases what we call endorphins which create good feelings in your body. That's why you often feel really good after playing sports or going for a jog. You should exercise often to enhance your health, happiness and, of course, also to prevent or control stress.
 - [4] Some countries have problems with exercise. A typical example is the United States. Many people there do not get enough exercise. It is hard to exercise for some people as they work too much, and, as a result, they don't have time. They work in office buildings sitting in a chair all day in front of a computer. You cannot get much exercise from this kind of work environment.
 - [5] Some people get exercise walking from their homes to work or school. However, many people don't even get this kind of exercise as they live too far away or they lack time in their hectic schedules. First, people do not have a chance to exercise because they are sitting in their cars or on buses for 2 to 4 hours of inactivity each day. Second, people are exhausted when they get home late at night. Then people are not willing to exercise after a long day at work; they do not have this habit. This can cause problems.
 - [6] Today, many countries have problems with obesity. This causes a lot of health problems like heart disease and diabetes, and also costs various governments a lot of tax money. Doctors say that exercise is vital in order to help people both lose weight and improve their overall health. So many people are trying to increase the daily exercise rates. It takes time to change though and when people see slow results, they

- lose interest almost immediately. Habits should be made to change lifestyles and improve overall health immediately. After all, can we really postpone our health?

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Choose-your-own-adventure is back!

[1] Have you ever wanted to tell a film or TV character what to do? Now, thanks to the latest film-making technologies, you can. Netflix and other streaming services have started offering choose-your-own-adventure films and TV shows. At various

points in the story, you can use your remote control to choose between two options — like choosing left or right at a fork in a road. Each choice decides how the story will unfold.




[2] This format got its start in 2017, with Netflix's release of the kids' shows *Puss in Book* and *Buddy Thunderstruck*. American video game developer Telltale Games followed Netflix's lead by releasing *Minecraft: Story Mode*, an online series that allows viewers to create their own story by pointing and clicking their mouse. In 2019, Netflix released *You vs. Wild*, a reality series starring survival expert Bear Grylls. Viewers decide what Grylls does to survive in the wild.

[3] Choose-your-own-adventure storytelling can be traced back to *Sugarcane Island*, an interactive children's book written by American author Edward Packard. Published in 1976, the book was the first story in the *Adventures of You* series. Packard got the idea for choose-your-own-adventure while telling a bedtime story to his two daughters. Running out of ideas for the story, he asked them to decide what the main character did next. They were very excited to be able to add to the story. Packard realised that he had come up with a new way of storytelling.

[4] In 1979, Bantam Books published its *Choose Your Own Adventure* book series. Like the *Adventures of You* books, *Choose Your Own Adventure* stories are told using the pronoun *you*. This puts the reader in the position of the main character. At every 'branch' of the story, readers have to choose between two options. Each one takes them to a different page. *Choose Your Own Adventure* went on to become one of the most popular children's series of the 1980s and 90s.

[5] Fans of choose-your-own-adventure storytelling have waited several decades for film and TV technology to become advanced enough for interactive stories. Their wait is finally over, and the story is — once again — in their own hands. The question is — what will they do next?
