### SOURCE A

The following propaganda cartoon was published during the May Fourth Movement in 1919.



#### SOURCE B

The following is adapted from a commentary made by the American philosopher John Dewey in 1921 regarding his personal experience in the May Fourth Movement.

The movement is still for the most part a feeling rather than an idea. It is also accompanied by the extravagances and confusions, and undigested medley of wisdom and nonsense that inevitably mark so ambitious a movement in its early stages...One could easily hold up the whole movement to ridicule, as less than half-baked, as an uncritical, more or less hysterical mixture of unrelated ideas and miscellaneous pieces of Western science and thought...

- (a) If you were a commoner in 1919, would you support the May Fourth Movement? Explain your answer with reference to Source A. (3 marks)
- (b) Why did Dewey think that the May Fourth Movement was 'a feeling rather than an idea'? Cite *two* clues from Source B to explain your answer.
  (4 marks)
- (c) 'The May Fourth Movement was more successful as a patriotic movement than as an ideological movement.' Do you agree? Explain your answer with reference to Sources A and B, and using your own knowledge.
  (8 marks)
