Marking Scheme (key elements)

Part A

Content:

- A detailed description of the criminal behaviour (e.g. who, when, where, what, how, etc.)
- A criminal behaviour that students might witness on their way to school (e.g. it should not be something that would happen at night)
- Their feelings

Language:

- The past tense: describing what happened and their feelings
- The use of adjectives and adverbs

Tone and Organization:

- Talking to the diary ("you")
- Informal (like unit 1, text 1)

Part B

Content:

- Describe the activities in the pictures with details (e.g. what, when, where, etc.)
- Talk about how the participants felt during the outing
- More advanced students: did something adventurous in the outing (e.g. something creative ☐ saw a shark when they went kayaking)
- Include some basic information about the outing (i.e. date, time, venue, etc.)
- Can promote the club to others

Language:

- The past tense: describing what happened in the outing and how participants felt
- The use of prepositions of time and place
- The use of adjectives and adverbs

Tone and Organization:

- Use connectives to show the sequencing
- A title is included
- Organize the events into separate paragraphs with a proper introduction and conclusion
