## Minutes of a meeting

### Meeting between the Local Community Committee and members of the local community

Date: 27th February 2021

Venue: Town Hall

Time: 7.30 pm

#### Minutes of Meeting

##### 1.0 Chairperson welcome

- 1.1 Evan Fung, Committee Chairperson, welcome committee members and members of the local community to the meeting.

##### 2.0 Tea Tea Place

- 2.1 Mr. Fung confirmed the focus of the meeting: to discuss the closure of our local café Tea Tea Place.
- 2.2 Mr. Au, owner of Tea Tea Place explained that he had no option but to close down Tea Tea Place due to financial difficulties, including increasing costs and lower profits. He felt bad that this had affected the community.
- 2.3 Mr. Wu, a local resident who works as a marketing executive, suggested planning a publicity campaign including the distribution of posters and distribution of leaflets to let the community know about the potential closure of the café, and also to promote it to other members of the public. There could also be radio interviews to talk about the café and how the local community is working together to stop its closure.
- 2.4 Mr. Fung asked for attendees to raise their hands if they agreed with such a publicity campaign. All attending raised their hands, voting for posters and leaflets to be distributed and interviews to be arranged with local radio stations.

Action: The committee is to design the posters and leaflets, and to contact local radio stations.



2.5 Mrs. Kim, a local resident, suggested hiring social media influencers to promote Tea Tea Place.

2.6 Mr. Fung asked for attendees to raise their hands if they agreed with such a publicity campaign. A lot of attendees voiced their concern that it would be expensive to hire an influencer. Some are concerned that influencers might not be able to reach a wide audience. The idea was rejected.

2.7 Miss Chow, a local resident, suggested assistance to the business to help with its financial problems. She suggested that the committee employ a business and marketing consultant to help Mr. Au. Attendees voted in agreement for this suggestion.

Action: The committee is to start finding a consultant.

2.8 Miss Lee, a local resident who works as a website designer, suggested creating a website for Tea Tea Place to improve their business. The history about Tea Tea Place, the menu, special events and other fun information could be shared on the site. Miss Lee volunteered to create this website. Attendees voted in agreement for this suggestion. Mr. Fung and Mr. Au thanked Miss Lee for her support.

I talked to a business and marketing consultant about Tea Tea Place (I think she sounded professional; we might consider hiring her).

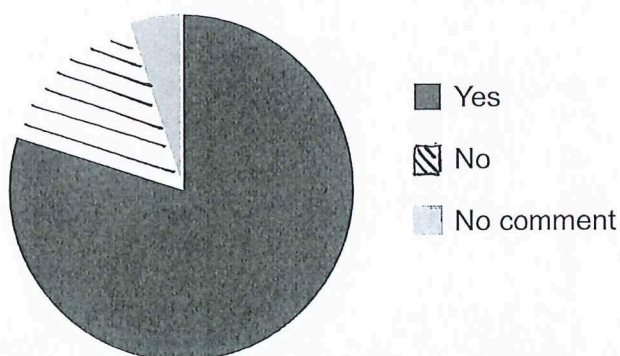
She suggested we also work on some social media presence as part of the business assistance we are planning for the business. Could you please add this to our proposal?
