His rise to fame has been dramatic, from a barely known director of TV advertisements, to one of Hong Kong's best directors of plays.

Home green home

Since the mid-1970s, Mike Reynolds, founder of Earthship Biotecture has goal build had one to green environmentally friendly houses. His designs have become more advanced over the years but his new Earthships are still built with three aims: to be made from environmentally friendly materials, to be powered by clean energy sources and to be easy and

inexpensive to build. Living in an Earthship sounds like something out of a science fiction film, doesn't it? However, for people who want to lead a green lifestyle, living in an Earthship has become a great green choice.

15 Although the walls of Earthships can also be made of concrete, stone, aluminium cans and plastic bottles, recycled rubber tyres have become the normal material to use because they are easy to find and change to 'bricks'. More than 2 million tyres have piled up in rubbish heaps in the United States. In addition, rubber tires filled with earth weigh up to 150 kg each so they can support heavy loads. They also 20 keep the house cool in summer and warm in the winter, which means that residents don't have to keep air conditioners at 25.5 degrees and they don't have to use air conditioners at all as their houses remain as cold as ice!

Earthships put a stop to wasting water and electricity. They have special roofs that catch and store rainwater. Once this clean water has come out of taps or showers, 25 it becomes 'grey water', which is used again. Many people say 'Yuck!' when they hear about grey water. However, when **they** realise that it is used only in toilets and garden hoses, their disgust turns to amazement. By the time they learn that Earthships are powered entirely by the wind and sun, wind turbines and solar panels, their amazement has usually become one word: 'wow'!

30 Mike Reynolds hopes that in the future all houses will be built with sustainability in mind just like his Earthships are. As we all know time is running out to reverse climate change. Any innovative designs such as the Earthships are a welcome change to our climate destroying present designs. The world needs more likeminded people to address the world's problems.


